DECLARATION ON SERVICE OF COMPLAINTS-IN-INTERPLEADER
(Alturas Indian Rancheria, California Valley Miwok Tribe, Cayuga Nation, Picayune
Rancheria Of Chukchansi Indians, and Shoshone-Arapaho Joint Business Council)

Comes now BETH VERDEKAL and, being first duly sworn, states as follows:

1. I am Senior Project Manager at Kurtzman Carson Consultants (“KCC”).
2. KCC is the Settlement Administrator selected by Class Counsel and approved by the Court to carry out the functions required by § VIII.D.4. of the Final Settlement Agreement (“FSA”). (*Unopposed Motion for Approval of Class Counsel’s Engagement of KCC / Gilardi & Co., LLC, as Settlement Administrator*, Doc. 1331). I am responsible for supervising settlement administration services provided by KCC.
3. I make this declaration in connection with *Class Counsel’s First Report to the Court on the Distribution Process*.

4. With respect to each complaint-in-interpleader filed in this litigation (Docs. ##1365 – 1371), since October 2016 I have been researching contact information for, and possible attorneys representing, all of the defendants-in-interpleader.

5. Five interpleaders are still active. In two of those interpleaders, defendants in the contesting factions have either appeared through counsel or waived service of the summons and complaint. In one of those two, the Court has stayed proceedings at the request of the defendants-in-interpleader. The Court has also stayed proceedings in a third action at the request of the defendants-in-interpleader. In a fourth interpleader, one faction has waived service, appeared, and filed an answer. The other factions, however, have not yet appeared. Finally, in the fifth interpleader, neither faction's members have yet appeared or waived service.

RETURNED WAIVERS

6. With respect to the Alturas Indian Rancheria, Philip Del Rosa and Darren Del Rosa, represented by Fredericks Peebles & Morgan, returned their waiver of service on December 12, 2016. Wendy Del Rosa, represented by Rappaport & Marston, returned her waiver of service on February 14, 2017.

7. With respect to the California Valley Miwok Tribe, the Burley Faction returned its waiver of service on December 12, 2016, and the Dixie Faction returned its waiver of service on December 6, 2016. The Court on February 13, 2017, granted a stay of proceedings pending the resolution of proceedings before the Department of the Interior or until further order of the Court.

UNRETURNED WAIVERS

8. Two factions claim leadership of the Cayuga Nation, the “Halftown Group” with five members led by Clint Halftown, and the “Unity Council” with six members. Mr. Halftown, according to his counsel, has agreed to waive service of the summons, but we have not yet received that waiver. The five other individuals in the Halftown Group have not waived service. Counsel who has represented the Unity Council in other litigation has not returned my calls asking whether he would be able to waive service of the summons.

9. The competing Tribes associated with the Joint Business Council of the Shoshone and Arapaho Tribes are attempting to reach a settlement. The Court granted a stay on the matter for 90 days on February 13, 2017, “to allow Defendants-in-Interpleader time to finalize a settlement and address related logistical matters.”

10. With respect to the Picayune Rancheria of Chukchansi Indians, one waiver of service was supplied by Fredericks & Peebles, which represents six of the named defendants. I have now determined the attorneys identified as having represented the remaining individuals in other litigation either lack authority to sign the waiver or no longer represent the individuals. I have no further information as to who might represent the individuals. We are coordinating with Class Counsel to have the remaining defendants individually served with summons and the complaint. Class Counsel have told me that there is some indication that the parties may have resolved this leadership dispute.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct and that this declaration was executed this 3rd day of March 2017, at San Rafael, California.
